Extreme Weather	Sunburn Hypothermia Hyperthermia	Instructor to check weather forecast prior to activity & observe conditions throughout. If necessary change plans, amend route & move to safety. Ensure participants have suitable & adequate clothing plus access to warm (or cold) drinks Remind visiting staff & young people about sun protection.	No further action at this stage	
Equipment Failure	Various injuries	All equipment checked prior to use. Regular checks, maintenance & renewal schedule All equipment to correspond to required standards Personal protective equipment checked for correct fitting & monitored throughout activity by the instructor	No further action at this stage	
Fall From height	Serious injury	Participants to be supervised at top of crag Effective group management particularly of descent routes Clearly defined heights & correct 'spotting' technique if unroped Briefing & supervision Instructor must give consideration to own safety during setting up	No further action at this stage	
Falling objects	Serious injury	Helmets worn on, below & close to the activity site. Suitable venue choice Briefing & supervision	No further action at this stage	

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Belayer Error	Serious injury	Qualified instructor Briefing & supervision Abseiling to have independently controlled safety system Peer belaying – not normally reliant on a single person	No further action at this stage	
Entrapment (venue) eg between rocks	Various injuries	Suitable venue choice Qualified & experienced instructor Ensure participants have suitable & adequate clothing	No further action at this stage	
Entrapment (equipment)	Various injuries	Briefing – correct technique, loose hair & clothing to be tied back Releasable abseil system	No further action at this stage	
Members of the public	Various	Venue choice Qualified & experienced instructor	No further action at this stage	
Participants	Various	Participants asked to share relevant previous & existing medical issues. Visiting group leaders asked any other (eg behavioural) issues Staff ratios (group size) amended as required	No further action at this stage
